

Years ago, I decided to learn more about suiseki and how to make daizas one winter. Like anything else, the more you make, the more you learn. I think my first few daizas started out pretty rough, but eventually I managed to get pretty good at it. Therefore, I'm not spending this January and February making daizas for stones. I needed to find a new addiction!

I've always been interested in bonsai pots. I guess it comes with the territory. I admit, I also had a lot of fun making those slabs during our November meeting. On top of that, I also look at a lot of bonsai pottery on various FaceBook pages and auction sites. Seeing that I needed to learn something new and I needed a new addiction, I decided to learn how to make bonsai pots.

Like many people, I learn best by doing. When it comes to bonsai pots, I already knew what I liked. Even though I've never actually made a bonsai pot myself, I've actually written a couple of articles and I've done a number of presentations on what makes a good bonsai pot. It was really just a matter of taking what I already knew and putting it to practice. I've worked with clay in the past, but high school was over 30 years ago. Luckily, I found this thing called YouTube. I've used YouTube for things like minor auto repair and hiking trail research, so why not pottery? I ended up finding and watching a bunch of videos on how to make bonsai pots from clay slabs. From that point, I made the leap. I purchased some tools, some glaze and 100lbs. of clay! (Seriously, 100lbs!) This week I'm on about my 12th pot. Some have been unglazed and I'll be glazing some in the near future. The ones that I'm going to glaze are currently being bisque fired. I'll let you know how they turn out.

Just like I how get excited by pottery, our IBC vice president, Alyssa Batula, is excited about scrolls. Scrolls traditionally play a key role in classical bonsai display. Although you may not see scrolls at smaller local shows, you see them frequently displayed at big shows like the US National Bonsai Exhibition. Most of the time it's because local shows don't provide a good backdrop where a scroll can be hung. At this year's Garfield Park Show, we plan to use the club's shoji screens between tables so we can make use of scrolls in this year's display. That way, we can use some of what we learn from Alyssa's upcoming Scroll presentation. I'm looking forward to seeing it.




